

Tools and Resources

Tools:

Click on the button "Listen" to hear a voice read the page out loud.



Each sentence and word will be highlighted as it is read.

While the voice is reading, a small control panel appears on the webpage. You can play, pause, or stop the voice by clicking the buttons in the control panel:

You may also adjust the volume, change settings, or download the audio file:

If you only want to hear one sentence or word, highlight that section with your mouse, and then click "Listen" or the ReadSpeaker icon that will appear near your cursor after you have selected the text.


